Store It, Don’t Pour It

Please pour any fats, oils and grease into a metal can then dispose of the can with your weekly garbage.

What you pour down your sink can “drain” your bank account. Fats, oils, and grease can cause sewer backups by blocking the main sewer lines as well as those on private property, causing

expensive property damage. The Village is asking its residents and businesses to “store it, don’t pour it”.

Residents are asked to store fats and grease in a disposable container. Used cooking oil should be cooled and put into a covered plastic bottle, labeled and put out for garbage collection.

72 Hour Emergency Kit

No one knows for sure when disaster will strike, but we can all be prepared. Create your own 72-hour emergency kit, in a easy to carry backpack, duffle bag or suitcase, in an easily accessible location where everyone in the house knows where it is. The kit will provide the necessary items to help you and your family until emergency responders can reach you. Following are items you may want to include in your kit:

Food and Water (3 day supply)

- protein/granola bars, crackers and cereals, trail mix, canned juice, (food not requiring refrigeration), water (4 L per person)

Bedding and Clothing

- change of clothing, raincoats, sleeping bags

Light and Fuel

- hand-crank/battery operated flashlights, candles, lighter, waterproof matches

Equipment

- manual can opener, dishes, utensils, radio, axe/pocket knife, rope, pen and paper, whistle, small stove

Personal Supplies and Medication

- first-aid kit, toiletries, medication, pet food, garbage bags

Copies of Personal Documents, Money (in waterproof container)

- legal documents (birth certificates, passports), insurance policies, cash in small bills/credit cards, copy of your emergency plan and contact information

AND....

Update your kits every six (6) months to make sure food, water and medication have not expired, clothing fits, personal documents are up-to-date, and batteries charged.

Lougheed Field House News

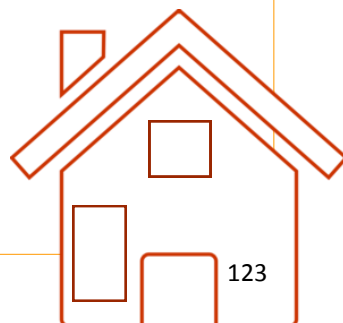
