FAIR EXHIBITOR'S ETIQUETTE

1. Read the prize list carefully and follow the requirements closely. All entries not complying with the prize list may be disqualified.
2. Read the judging standards to know what quality you are aiming for and how your entry will be judged.
3. Be sure your entries are clean, neat and presentable. Follow any instructions for presentation given in the fair book.
4. Fill out your entry form carefully. Be sure you've entered into the right category.
5. Properly label or tag all entries.
6. Make sure all entries arrive at the exhibit hall on time.
7. Be open minded. You can't always win, but great satisfaction can be derived from showing your work.
8. If you have questions or suggestions that would improve the fair or your exhibits for next year, take time to talk to the organizers.
9. If you had a good time, consider volunteering to assist at next year's fair.

All exhibits other than livestock to be on display by 12:00 noon, Friday, August 7th, at which time they will be judged. Sincere appreciation is expressed by the Lougheed Agricultural Society for the whole hearted support accorded us by the donors and sponsors in the Prize List. We extend a special thanks to those individuals who have volunteered time and effort to help organize this year's fair, and to the hundreds of patrons who attend the Annual Fair.

Rules and Regulations — Entry Fees

1. The Society may retain an amount not to exceed ten per cent of the prize money won.
2. In boys' and girls' classes no prize money will be retained. Age of children as of January 1, 2009
3. No person will be allowed to exhibit in any section of the fair who is not a member of the Lougheed Agricultural Society, or who has not paid an exhibitors fee of \$2. Any intending exhibitor can pay either fee at the time of making entry. An exhibitors fee of \$2 per class will be charged on livestock.
4. No person will be allowed to enter more than one exhibit in a class. This does not apply to livestock.
5. All exhibits must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor, and in the case of industrial work, must have been executed by the exhibitor.
6. Exhibitors are particularly requested to note that articles which have been previously shown at this Exhibition cannot be entered again, with the exception of flowering or potted plants and livestock.
7. **All exhibits of horses to be on display by 9 AM, cattle on display by 11 AM on the day of the fair. All other exhibits to be on display not later than 12 PM Friday, August 7. Exhibits on display from 11 AM to 4 PM on Saturday. Exhibits not to be removed before 4 PM on Saturday, but must be collected before 5 PM.**
8. Any exhibitor who refuses a prize awarded by the judges shall forfeit all his prize money. All disputes to be left to the discretion of the directors for settlement.
9. The Society shall not be responsible for the loss of or accident to, any exhibit or person, nor for the payment or delivery of any special prize offered by any firm or individual.
10. All registration papers must be produced to the Secretary, and in no case shall prizes be awarded to entire animals unless they are registered. Prizes awarded to such animals over six months old shall not be paid until the papers are produced to the Secretary.
11. No animal can compete in more than one section of any one class, except for herd, team or special events.
12. In the event of this Society having to close down, any trophies given through said Society must be returned to the Board of Directors within one year of winning the same if they have not been won outright.
13. No animal may compete in any Special Class without competing first in the open class.
14. In any section in Livestock Classes with 7 or more entries, a fourth prize will be paid.
15. **PROTEST** - A protest must be made in writing and signed by the protester, accompanied by a \$15 deposit, which sum shall be forfeited to the Association if the protest is not sustained. The protest must be in the hands of the Secretary within six hours after the judging is finished. Protest of bench exhibitors must be presented in writing with a \$15 deposit to the directors by 2:00 pm Fair Day.
16. All exhibits in any section, placing will be made on the merits of the exhibit, at the discretion of the judge.
17. Livestock Classes: After third call, gate is closed.
18. **Entries must be properly and securely tagged or the exhibit will be disqualified.**

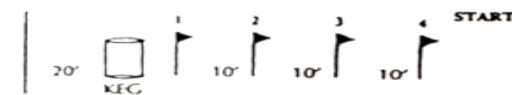

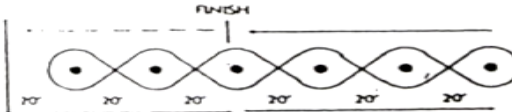

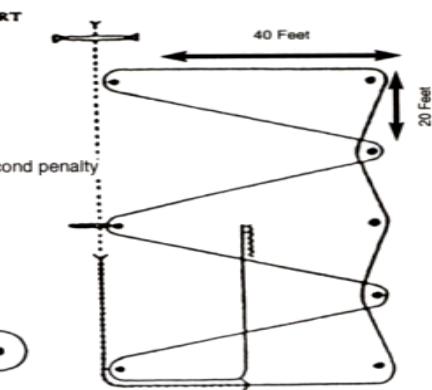
