DID YOU KNOW?

Each individual requires approximately 50 litres of clean water per day to ensure that basic health and vitality needs are met. On average, Albertans use 300 litres of water each day. That’s six times the required amount!

WAYS TO CONSERVE WATER

- Don’t hose down your driveway or sidewalk. Use a broom to clean leaves and other debris from these areas. Using a hose to clean a driveway can waste hundreds of gallons of water. Also, check outdoor faucets, sprinklers and hoses for leaks.
- Do you garden? Get a rain barrel to collect water for the garden.
- Don’t leave the water running in the kitchen when washing and rinsing dishes. Also, don’t leave the water on while brushing your teeth.

GARBAGE – Is everyone’s business. The village contracts the service of Flagstaff Regional Waste, regular pick-up being Monday. If you have excess, use the Transfer Site, Mondays 1- 6:30 pm and Fridays 9:00 - Noon
